We envision an India that is free from poverty and inequality, where all individuals, families and communities are thriving and enjoying a life of dignity, respect and safety.




#### **OUR MISSION**

# PROMOTING RESILIENT COMMUNITIES

### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH, ENGAGEMENT** & AWARENESS

With strict lockdowns in place, communities struggled with food insecurity, loss of livelihoods, and limited access to critical information and resources. Working with community leaders on the ground, our FED program provided emergency groceries to over 6,000 families, our Tribal Threads and Sundara livelihood programs created over 50,000 masks and bars of soap, and together we built mobile awareness campaigns and key messaging to protect against the spread of the virus.

## INCREASING ACCES TO QUALITY HEALTH CARE

STRENGTHENING THE LOCAL HEALTH CARE INFRASTRUCTURE

"The oxygen plants are sustainable, cost-effective medical assets for the underserved communities. Now everyone in the most remote areas has access to the most efficient COVID-19 treatments." -Kenneth Dsouza; CEO India



In order to bolster the capacity and response mechanism of rural hospitals we partnered with the local District Health authorities and IsraAID to build handwashing stations, hire additional medical support staff, provide lifesaving PPE, and install a vaporizer unit and oxygen generating facilities for critical care patients.
